South Fremont High School 16-17 Registration Schedule Fee Payments, Locker Assignments, and Senior/Individual Pictures

The schedule for registration, senior and individual pictures is shown below and is also available on our school website – sfscougars.com. You need to pick up and review your schedule, have your picture taken, and you can also pay fees. New students may also register with our counseling office during this time. Don't forget to order a yearbook

- Fee payment checks need to be made payable to South Fremont High School. \$10 fee on all returned checks
- Debit & Credit payments are not available.

- A list of fees will be available during registration.

EARLY locker assignments can be made during registration if Student Association Dues (\$25) are paid. FYI- This is NOT a Locker Fee-there is not a charge for lockers just an opportunity for early assignments. Lockers can also be assigned during the first weeks of school depending on availability. (Please note - We ask each student to pay Student Association Dues. They are distributed to Student Association activities, a class fee, and a student computer fee.)

All students, including seniors, need to have their pictures taken at the high school during registration for identification, yearbooks, and for activity cards. *Having your picture taken is free of charge and you are not obligated to purchase a picture package. *If you are purchasing a package you need to send a separate check made payable to Bell Photography. *Again, all students need to have pictures taken by Bell Photography as soon as possible.
