Schedules, Lockers, and Pictures

The schedule for registration is shown below and is also available on our school website – sfhscougars.com. You need to pick up and review your schedule, have your picture taken (Seniors will need 2 pictures taken), and you can also pay registration fees. New students may also register with our counseling office during this time.

- Registration payment checks need to be payable to South Fremont High School. **\$20 fee on all returned checks**
- Debit & Credit payments are not available at the school – Athletic fees can be paid online in Register My Athlete.
- A list of other registration fees will be available at the school.
- Your student should take notes the first day of school regarding add'l supplies for individual teachers/classrooms.

EARLY locker assignments can be made during registration if Student Association Dues (\$25) are paid.

FYI-This is **NOT** a Locker Fee! There is not a charge for lockers, just an opportunity for early assignments. Lockers can also be assigned during the first weeks of school depending on availability. (Please note - Each student will benefit from Student Association Dues). They are distributed to Student Association activities, a class fee, and a student computer fee.)

Sophomores – Wednesday, August 16, 10:00 am to 12 noon

- Having your picture taken is free of charge and you are not obligated to purchase a picture package.
- If you are purchasing a package you need to send a separate check payable to Bell Photography.
