Counseling News

Direct Admissions letters were sent to Idaho seniors and their parents from the State Board of Education. These letters were to inform you which Idaho colleges and/or universities accepted your student based on his/her grades and SAT/ACT scores. Students that want to attend a specific post-secondary school need to complete the admission process with that school.

Idaho College Application Week

College Application Week is a nationwide program to help every high school student apply to a college/university of choice and consider their post-secondary plans. This year, South Fremont High School will be hosting College Application Week

November 1-4.

Activities are planned throughout the week to focus on students' completion of college admission requirements, FAFSA, and career options. FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) night will happen November 3, from 3:30- 6:30 in the TWT lab at the high school. Parents are invited to bring their tax information and counselors will assist everyone to complete their individual FAFSA. The priority admission deadline for many schools is Dec 1.

A final drawing for college use items, including a laptop as the grand prize, will be held on Friday for all seniors who complete their college application paperwork. Join the fun, and help your seniors prepare for the next step in their educational journey!

Be sure to keep checking for scholarships on the school website and in the Career Information System website sponsored by the Idaho Department of Labor.

The next SAT is Dec 3 with final registration Nov 3. The next ACT is Dec 10 with a Nov 4 deadline. Juniors and Seniors are encouraged to take either of the tests to help determine their college readiness. If families qualify for the free or reduced lunch program, there are fee waivers available to cover the expense of the test. Registration links are on the school website.

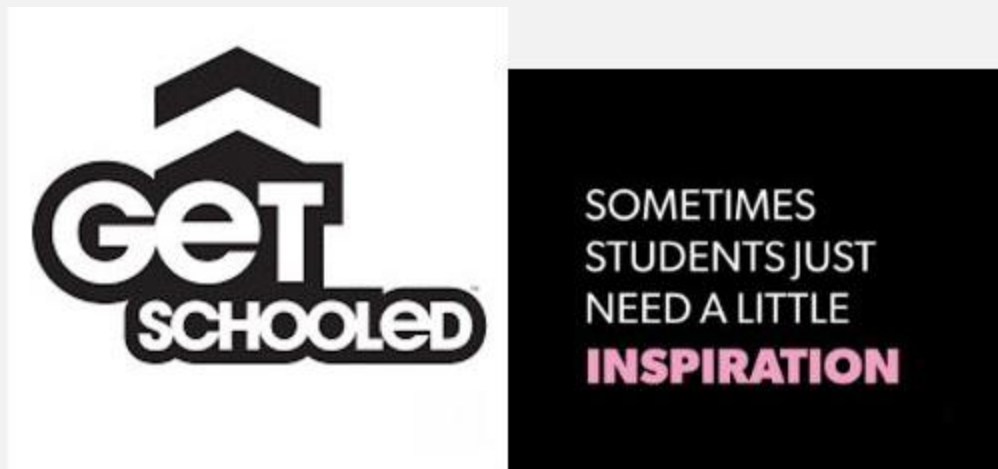

Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) Leadership Class

The class is diligently working on their Power of One projects. Students set personal goals in five different areas. We have been learning Parliamentary Procedure and students will participate in a practical application of it on Monday as they demonstrate what they have learned in a mock meeting. This week students will begin choosing their STAR events and begin their journey to competition.

FCCLA Chapter

Chapter Officers, Koby Parker, Taliya Lopez, and Angelica Chavez with District Officer Maylee Edwards and State Officers, Angella Grigg and Lyndi Loveland attended Joint Officer Leadership Training (JOLT) in Burley. They learned many things which they are bringing back to the chapter.

On November 11th, South Fremont High will be hosting District 6 Fall Leadership Conference. District and State officers have been hard at work planning and preparing for around 200 guests to attend.

Mr. Powell - Technology

We've been having a great year so far! At the beginning of the year we spend a lot of time in the classroom learning basic principles that will guide us in our projects throughout the remainder of the year.

The Drafting class is learning to measure using a scale. They have learned to use different scales to enlarge or shrink things to fit on their paper. This is in preparation for using the drafting tools and boards later this week. Until now, students have been learning to sketch, eyeball distances, and improving line quality.

Robotics students have assembled their first robots (Basebot) and have been practicing wireless arcade and tank control driving through a figure 8 course, shapes challenges, and writing their names with a marker attached to the basebot. It's tougher than it seems, but lots of fun! We will begin planning designs for our first class competition later this week. Teams will be randomly chosen, as alliances, for each round of the competition. The best design and drivers will have bragging rights as champions of this competition!

Woods classes are working on a project where they are cutting out various joints using hand tools. This is tougher than it seems too. Soon, we will be learning about the larger power tools in the shop and using them to begin working on the stools. Students will be learning to read a plan, bill of materials and a plan of procedure. They will also be making templates that will help them lay out the stool pieces on the material before cutting.

Technology students are finishing up their final plans in preparation for building bridges. Upon completion, all bridges will be 'tested to destruction' to see who's design was the strongest and most efficient. They will then evaluate why their bridges failed the way it did and try use the experience to improve their designs on the next project.

All classes have been working hard to get some of their STEAM requirements finished as well. We focus primarily on the engineering and technology reflections, but students can work on any they choose. It's exciting to see students begin to understand how what they learn in the classroom applies to daily life!

Business Education - Mrs. Berrett Computer Applications

Students are working hard in preparation for the Microsoft Office Specialist Certification in Word 2013. Students are also working on a STEAM reflection to upload this week.

Web Design

Students in web design are learning to code using HTML and CSS. Their skills and knowledge are continually improving. They are also working on a STEAM reflection to upload this week. HTML, CSS and coding knowledge of any kind, gives students skills that will help them in the future, even if they do not go into the field of web design. Coding knowledge is useful in any field.

Publishing

Students are learning some skills in Photoshop and will soon move to InDesign. The class is small, but talented. They will be designing the tickets, the flyers, and the program for the school play. Some of their work is displayed in the hall near the library. Stop by during PT conferences and take a look.

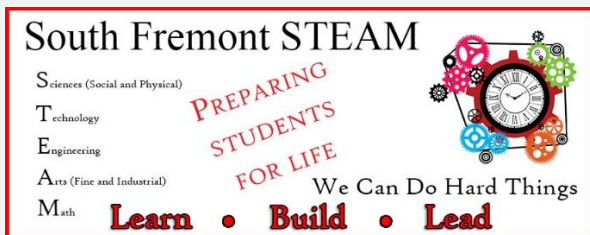
